Research England Announce £2bn University Investment

Research England has announced budgets for the recurrent funding of research and knowledge exchange for academic year 2018-19. In total, there is an overall increase of £70 million available in 2018-19. This increase in funding will enable higher education institutions (HEIs) in England to deliver on the government's industrial strategy and tackle global, national and local challenges. The following budgets are being increased:

- An additional £25 million for knowledge exchange through (HEIF)
- An additional £20 million for the postgraduate research degree supervision element of quality-related research (QR)
- An additional £10 million for the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF) element of QR
- An additional £6 million to contribute to the charity research element of QR

To help Northamptonshire businesses overcome some of the financial problems that hold them back from being more innovative, the Growth Hub is offering grants of up to £20,000 under its Innovate Northamptonshire project to encourage businesses to explore new ideas. Grants are available from £2,000 to £20,000 to support activities that lead to the development of new products, processes or services. This could be as simple as improving efficiencies and increasing production through streamlining processes, or being more ambitious and developing a prototype to introduce something brand new to the market. COST supports trans-national cooperation among researchers through 'COST Actions' dedicated to specific research themes. The newly funded COST Action aims to tackle the hurdles associated with the delivery of RNA-based therapeutics and is one of 39 brand new Actions starting this Spring and Autumn.

AHRC Language Acts and Worldmaking Small Grants Scheme (FAST, E&H)

Language Acts and Worldmaking is a flagship project funded by the AHRC Open World Research Initiative. Languages Memory is the theme for their first Conference in London on the 13th-14th June 2018. Small grants of up to £1,500 are available and applications are welcomed for workshops, conferences, public events, or other projects that resonate with the theme of Languages Memory.

ESRC's Sixteenth Festival of Social Science (H&S, E&H)

ESRC's annual Festival of Social Science is a week-long celebration that takes place around the UK. Through its programme of activities, social scientists are able to engage with non-academic audiences and increase awareness of the contributions the social sciences make to the economy and the wellbeing of UK society. This year's festival is on the 3rd-10th November and sponsorship of up to £1,000 per event is available.

UKRI Future Leaders Fellowships Scheme (ALL)

UKRI has launched its first funding opportunity in the form of the Future Leaders Fellowship (FLF) scheme. The scheme is designed to develop, retain, attract and sustain research and innovation talent in the UK by providing up to seven years of funding for at least 550 early-career researchers and innovators. Applications can be submitted in any area of research or innovation covered by the Research Councils and Innovate UK. Expression of Interest forms must be submitted by **7th June**. Big Lottery Fund Re-launches Reaching Communities England (H&S)

The Big Lottery Fund is seeking ideas for projects that will improve communities across England. Grants of more than £10,000 are available to support organisations that want to take action on the issues that matter to people and communities. The funding can support project activities, organisational development, operating costs and can support work for up to five years.

IUK – Commercialising Quantum Devices: Innovation R&D Competition (B&L)

The aim of the competition is to deliver working prototype 'second generation' quantum devices or systems that fulfil the technical and ergonomic requirements of end users. IUK will invest in projects that look at how quantum technologies could be used to create devices with radically new properties for commercially-viable products and services. £20 million has been allocated to fund innovation projects in this competition and expects total project costs to be between £3 million and £10 million.

AHRC Research in Film Awards 2018 (FAST, E&H)

The awards showcase, reward and recognise the best of the growing number of high-quality short films (defined as no longer than 30 minutes) linked to arts and humanities research, including by-products and records of research, primary output and film used for research. The Awards are split into five categories and the winner in each category will receive £2,000 towards their future film-making activities.

EIT Digital Challenge Open for European Tech Start-Ups (B&L, FAST)

The EIT Digital Challenge is an annual Europe-wide competition for the most innovative start-ups in digital technology ready to scale up. The Challenge offers an international growth package worth up to €100,000 to scale up businesses. In total, 25 scale-ups from the five different categories will be selected to pitch their product or service at the final event in October. The first prize winner in each category receives €50,000 and two best companies per category will gain 12 months in the EIT Digital Accelerator also worth €50,000.

BIAL Funding for Scientific Research 2018/2019 (H&S)

The BIAL Foundation supports and acknowledges medical research, including basic, clinical and neurophysiological research. Scientific Researcher Grants were launched by the BIAL Foundation in 1994 to encourage research into the fields of psychophysiology and parapsychology which is still largely unexplored. Grants of between €5,000 and €50,000 are available for a maximum of three years, projects must commence between 1 January and 31 October 2019.

The programme is designed to be hands-on and very practical. Researchers are expected to bring a piece of writing with them to work on throughout the day. Participants will create 6 potential days to spend drafting, writing and editing and themes relating to time management, work/life balance, prioritisation and motivation will be covered. Participants will learn how a small change can have a big impact and be given the opportunity to consider how you will use 6 days of extra time a year.
